RE: Year End Curricular Events

The purpose of this memo is to update the School Committee on year-end culminating activities at MERHS. As we continue our work to experiencial based student-centered learning, MERHS is implementing a different structure for the traditional "finals" week. In the past we have had a week of half day which included 90 minutes exams in each subject area. This year we will have a mix of experiential culminating activities exams, and reflections. Following is a summary:

- Based on year-long theme of course (Pursuit of Happiness/American Dream) students will engage in a creative, cumulative, texted-based dialogue performance (grade 11)

The schedule, show below, provides opportunities for teachers to meet with students in 95 minute and 28 minutes blocks. The 28-minute blocks will be a time for students to reflect on their learning. They will complete a Google Form that will prompt them to set a learning goal based on the Vision of the Graduate for the 2022 - 2023 school year. The form will be differentiated by department. Each will ask students to respond to questions that will allow the next year's teacher to have a head start in learning about students' backgrounds, interests and learning needs.

This change in practice is a step to developing a school environment where:

- Students reflect on their learning and skill development
- Teachers address the distinct needs, interests, aspirations, and cultural backgrounds of individual students
- Students are given the opportunity to make choices about their learning and contribute to the design of the learning experience
- Learning is connected to real-world issues, problems, and applications
