<u> Minding Your Minds – Student Program</u>

To further enhance our mental health education, we are bringing in a Young Adult Speaker from a nonprofit called <u>Minding Your Mind</u> for students. During this educational presentation, students will hear from <u>Morgan</u>, a young adult who has experienced several mental health challenges, developed healthy coping skills, and now shares a message of hope that support is available. This evidence-based program is aimed at ending the stigma around mental health challenges and conditions while encouraging students to seek help for themselves or a friend as early as possible. Our staff will continue to be available to any student seeking support before, during, and after this presentation.

Minding Your Minds – Caregiver Program

As part of our efforts to support parents and caregiver, we will be offering a workshop on Thursday 11/21 at 6:30pm hosted by <u>Minding Your Mind.</u> Just Talk About It is a clinician-led workshop covering adolescent mental health topics such as anxiety, depression, self-harm, disordered eating, substance use, social media, and suicide with the goal of ensuring that the adults supporting youth have the information to understand adolescent mental health, identify mental health challenges and crisis, and respond in helpful and supportive ways. This workshop is 90 minutes and features <u>Clinical Director Jon Mattleman</u> and <u>Young Adult Speaker Morgan H.</u> This is the same Young Adult Speaker who will present to students in the middle school earlier in the day.
