#### Absence Policy Reminder

#### Student Absences And Excuses (District Policy)

Regular and punctual school attendance is essential for success in school. The Committee does recognize that parents of children attending our schools have special rights as well as responsibilities, one of which is to ensure that their children attend school regularly, in accordance with state law.

Therefore, students may be excused temporarily from school attendance for the following reasons:

- 1. Illness or quarantine.
- 2. Bereavement or serious illness in family.
- 3. Weather so inclement as to endanger the health of the child.
- 4. Observance of major religious holidays.

A child may also be excused for other exceptional reasons with approval of the school administrator.

Accordingly, parents will provide a written explanation for the absence and tardiness of a child. This will be required in advance for types of absences where advance notice is possible.

In instances of chronic or irregular absence reportedly due to illness, the school administration may request a physician's statement certifying such absences to be justifiable.

# Background

During the 2020 school year MERHS will take part in the accreditation process by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). MERHS will be one of the first schools to take part in this process under NEASC's new standards for accreditation. The first step in the process is a Self-Reflection. MERHS School Council will serve as the Self Reflection committee. In order to initiate this process, students, families and faculty are asked to complete surveys designed to provide the school with feedback about how MERHS meets NEASC's standards. The data from the survey, along with other evidence, will be used to identify areas of strength and areas for growth. A school improvement plan will be developed from the data. During the accreditation visit in 2020, the NEASC visiting committee will review our progress in the implementation of the improvement plan.

# Definitions

There are several terms used by NEASC that we thought could use further explanation; they are listed below:

The **vision of the graduate** includes the transferable skills, knowledge, understandings, and dispositions necessary for future success.

**Transferable skills** are the essential skills students need to be able to confront new challenges both in and outside of school. Transferable skills include creativity, critical thinking, communication and collaboration, for example.

**Dispositions** are the patterns of behavior and thinking necessary for success in and out of school. Dispositions include persistence, flexibility, empathy, courage, and accuracy, for example.

### **Survey Development**

The survey is a newly developed tool by NEASC. The School Council has reviewed the survey questions. We have reported grammatical errors, questions about substance and length, as well concerns about clarity to NEASC. They acknowledge the errors, but will not make changes at this time. <u>Please understand MERHS is not able to alter this survey in any way.</u>
